## Bylaw No. 09-13

## Rural Municipality of Beaver River No. 622

A Bylaw to amend Bylaw No. 3-13 known as the Zoning Bylaw.

he Council of the R.M. of Beaver River No. 622, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts to amend Bylaw No. 3-13 as follows:

1. The Zoning District Map, which forms a part of the zoning Bylaw No. 3-13 shall be amended as follows:

By rezoning from Lakeshore Development 1 District (LD1)- to Lakeshore Development 2 District (LD2), all that land within shaded area on the attached diagram, which forms part of this Bylaw.

- 2. Amend Lakeshore Development 1 District (LD1)- Trailer Coaches and Recreational Vehicles used as Bedrooms 5.6.15 as follows:
  - Remove "for a period exceeding 14 consecutive days"
  - Replace with "for a period exceeding 21 consecutive days within a calendar year"
  - Add subsection "5.6.15 e) the trailer coach or recreational vehicle has a valid temporary development permit"
- Amend Lakeshore Development 2 District (LD2) Additional Standards for Motor Home and Trailer Homes 5.7.20 f)

as follows:

- a) Removing "A second temporary motor home or trailer home will be allowed as a visitor to the site for a period of no more than 21 consecutive days."
- b) And replacing with "A second temporary motor home or trailer home will be allowed with a valid temporary development permit as a visitor to the site for a period of no more than 21 consecutive days within a calendar year."
- 4. Amend Lakeshore Development 3 District (LD3) Additional Standards for Motor Home and Trailer Homes 5.8.19 f)

as follows:

- Removing "A second temporary motor home or trailer home will be allowed as a visitor to the site for a period of no more than 21 consecutive days."
- And replacing with "A second temporary motor home or trailer home will be allowed with a valid temporary development permit as a visitor to the site for a period of no more than 21 consecutive days within a calendar year."
- 5. Amend Lakeshore Development 4 District (LD4) Other Regulations 5.9.11 as follows:
  - a) Removing "If there is an existing principle residence, the owner may store their recreational vehicle providing it is not used as a second residence"
  - b) And replacing with "A second temporary motor home or trailer home will be allowed with a valid temporary development permit as a visitor to the site for a period of no more than 21 consecutive days within a calendar year."

2. This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect when approved by the Minister.
