The 2021 Assessment Roll

As per Ministerial orders, the Assessment Roll for 2021 will remain open from April 20 to June 21.

PROPERTY ASSESSMENT DOES NOT EQUAL PROPERTY TAX

SAMA's role in determining assessed value for properties is just the first part of a process established by provincial legislation. The second part is application of provincial government established tax policy, such as property classes and percentage of value, and statutory exemptions. The third and final part of the process involves municipalities annually determining the local mill rate based on local budget needs. The province sets the mill rate for the education sector. Municipalities then multiply the taxable assessment by the local mill rate to produce property tax levies, also known as your property tax bill.

Please note: The only time you can appeal is <u>now</u> until June 21 on your property tax assessment, you CANNOT appeal your tax bill.

As per RM Bylaw 2-14:

"A second temporary motor home or trailer home will be allowed as a visitor to the site for a period of no more than 21 consecutive days within a calendar year."

Property Tax Percentages of Value Updated for 2021

Government Relations Minister Don McMorris announced the percentages of value to be applied to properties starting in 2021, as part of the revaluation cycle across the province.

For 2021, the percentage of value for commercial, industrial, elevator, railway, resource and pipeline properties will be 85 per cent compared to 100 per cent set in 2017 when the previous revaluation occurred.

"This change improves tax fairness by narrowing the range of percentages of value that apply to property assessments," McMorris said. "The adjustment also recognizes the COVID-19 challenges faced by businesses and industries so they remain competitive to help create jobs for Saskatchewan families."

All other percentages of value remain unchanged from the previous revaluation cycle:

- Non-arable (range or pasture) land at 45 per cent.
- Other (cultivated) agricultural land at 55 per cent.
- Residential, multi-unit residential and seasonal residential at 80 per cent.

Education property tax mill rates are determined as part of the annual provincial government budget process.

Provincial legislation requires all Saskatchewan properties be revalued every four years, since their values change over time. Along with this update, the provincial government reviews the percentages of value for different types of property.

The assessed value of a property (calculated by an appraiser) multiplied by a percentage of value determines its taxable assessment. The taxable assessment is then multiplied by a mill rate (as established by municipalities for the municipal portion and the provincial government for the education portion) to determine the amount of property tax owed.

GRAVEL HAUL & SPREAD TENDER, 2021

The RM of Beaver River No. 622 hereby invites tenders from qualified contractors in order to award a contract for the following:

Hauling and spreading of approximately 20,000 tonnes of road gravel to complete 2021 municipal road maintenance program.

The 2021 gravel program will encompass 2 quarries with hauling/spreading volumes as described below:

- 1) RM Pit N.E. 21-61-25-W3 (Approx. 5 miles South of Pierceland on Highway 21 and 4 miles East on TWP 621A): Haul/Spread from Stockpile: Approx. 10,000 tonnes (Hauler responsible for supplying personnel, equipment, and scale for all loading)
- 2) RM Pit N.E. 14-61-21-W3 (Approx. 3.5 miles South of Highway 55 on RR 3212):
 Haul/Spread from Stockpile: Approx. 10,000 tonnes (Hauler responsible for supplying personnel, equipment, and scale for all loading)

Please provide quotes based on the assumption that the RM of Beaver River No. 622 will supply personnel for gravel checking.

The Contractor shall furnish all labour and equipment to perform the work as specified herein. Bids must be based on legal road weights. Minimum of 6 trucks, the municipality reserves the right to stop daily hauling operation at such time(s) when 3 or less trucks are available.

The municipality reserves the right to stop hauling operation during periods of inclement weather when, in the opinion of the municipality or gravel checker, the roads are susceptible to structural or surface damage.

We wish to invite tenders from contractors who are capable of completing the contract per the following timeline:

Spring 2021 (dependent upon weather and current COVID pandemic)

In order to provide a semblance of consistency in the tendering process, we ask that you please complete the tender form attached to the tender document available at the RM office or on our website www.rmofbeaverriver622.ca, and attach additional descriptions as requested.

Tenders are to be received at the RM of Beaver River office no later than 4:00 P.M. CST, May 19, 2021.

The lowest or any tender is not necessarily accepted.

Property Revaluation Year

Provincial legislation requires all properties in Saskatchewan be revalued once every four years. For the 2021 revaluation, the base date used for assessment values is January 1, 2019. This ensures assessed values are more current, as property values change over time.

Burn Permits

Burn permits are required April 1 to October 31.

- 1. No burning of any material shall be allowed within the boundaries of the Municipality from April 1 to October 31, without the prior obtainment of a burning permit. Failure to obtain a permit could result in a fire department callout and monetary charges to the landowner.
- 2. The permit shall be issued from the RM office free of charge.
- 3. The RM retains the right to refuse to issue or cancel burning permit if council feels that conditions are not suitable to burn.
- 4. The following condition shall be indicated on permit: "The landowner is totally responsible for the fire until it is completely extinguished."

Council may at any time impose a fire ban.

New Tax Exemption Information

Effective January 1, 2021 Section 293 of The Municipalities Act was amended, removing farm dwelling exemption in unorganized hamlets.

(o) "hamlet" means: (i) an unincorporated community with: (A) five or more occupied dwellings individually situated on lots, blocks or parcels; and (B) at least 10 subdivided lots, blocks or parcels, the majority of which are an average size of less than one acre; or (ii) any unincorporated area declared to be a hamlet by order of the minister pursuant to this Act or any former Act providing for the establishment of hamlets;
