Invitation to Tender
**2022/2023 Septic Hauling for the
Lac des Iles Water Treatment Plant**

The Lac des Iles Utility Commission hereby invites tenders from qualified contractors in order to award a contract for the following:

- ♦ Hauling of waste and wastewater from the Lac des Iles water treatment plant to the sewage lagoon.
- ♦ Hauling and spreading of clean wastewater on local roads, authorized by Water Security, in the summer months to aid in dustproofing those roads. The process of spreading clean waste water on Lauman's and RM roadways requires operator to clean truck septic tanks prior to the loading and spreading of clean waste water.

Please submit tenders indicating a price based **per gallon** hauled. The approximate fluid volume is 650 000 gallons per year.

OTHER TENDER DETAILS

- The contractor shall be responsible to supply all required equipment and pay all associated costs of operating of equipment, etc.
- The contractor shall be responsible to supply and pay all associated costs of employees or labor to complete work indicated above.
- The contractor shall supply to the Lac des Iles Utility Commission a copy of their Permit to Transport and Dispose of Liquid Domestic Waste upon awarding of the tender.
- The contractor shall supply to the Lac des Iles Utility Commission a copy of their Commercial Plate insurance upon awarding of the tender.
- The contractor shall obtain Saskatchewan Worker's Compensation Board coverage and shall supply the Lac des Iles Utility Commission with a copy of said insurance coverage upon awarding of the tender.
- The contractor shall obtain liability insurance in the amount of \$2,000,000 (Two million dollars) and shall supply the Lac des Iles Utility Commission with proof of liability insurance upon awarding of the tender.
- An equipment list **MUST** be submitted with bid form.

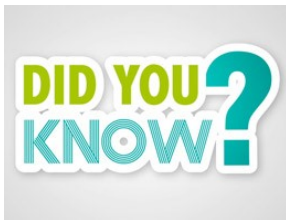

The RM of Beaver River has a policy regarding docks on the south shoreline of Lac des Iles where our lakeshore subdivisions are along the lakeshore.

This policy is: **700-01 Docks and Watercraft Placement Fronting RM622-managed shore-front; Lac des Iles South Shoreline**

The intent of this Policy is to provide for orderly and compliant placement of docks and watercraft lifts fronting those portions of the Lac des Iles south shoreline that fall within RM 622's management jurisdiction.

There are many regulations in this policy but some highlights are:

- ◆ Applicants must be owners of lakeshore development properties whose subdivisions share a common border with the Meadow Lake Provincial Park East boat launch lease area.
- ◆ Permits will be allocated on a first come, first-served basis until such time as the available space within the Meadow Lake Provincial Park East Boat Launch Lease, is full to allowable capacity. Allowable capacity would follow Transport Canada's Navigable Waters Protection Act and Regulations.
- ◆ Should a representative or member no longer own property at the subdivision or is no longer zoning bylaw compliant, it is deemed that he or she has forfeited their right to a boat dock.
- ◆ Should a vacancy arise, the person next on the waiting list for a boat dock shall pay their one time non-refundable equipment purchase fee to obtain their space on the boat slip.

Remembrance Day Did you Know

Remembrance Day was first observed in 1919 throughout the British Commonwealth. It was originally called "Armistice Day" to commemorate armistice agreement that ended the First World War on Monday, November 11, 1918, at 11 a.m. —on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month.

From 1921 to 1930, Armistice Day was held on the Monday of the week in which November 11 fell. In 1931, Alan Neill, Member of Parliament for Comox-Alberni, introduced a bill to observe Armistice Day only on November 11. Passed by the House of Commons, the bill also changed the name to "Remembrance Day". The first Remembrance Day was observed on November 11, 1931.

Every year on November 11, Canadians pause in a moment of silence to honour and remember the men and women who have served, and continue to serve Canada during times of war, conflict and peace. We remember the more than 2,300,000 Canadians who have served throughout our nation's history and the more than 118,000 who made the ultimate sacrifice.

The poppy is the symbol of Remembrance Day. Replica poppies are sold by the Royal Canadian Legion to provide assistance to Veterans.
