

Property taxes are due December 31, 2023 but ratepayers can take advantage of discounts on the municipal portion of your taxes by paying early. The school tax portion of your property taxes cannot be discounted.

2022 Municipal Tax Levy

- Ag. Land (Arable & Non-arable)- \$308,371 Includes: Range land, pasture land
- Seasonal Residential & Residential- \$1,134,755 Includes: All residential and recreational dwellings in the municipality: acreages, farm yards, subdivision lots, lake lots
- Commercial (Resource & Other)- \$396,650 Includes: Land and Improvements used for business purposes:Petroleum oil wells, gas wells, wholesale, retail, service



Municipal Tax Calculation:

Taxable Assessment x Mill rate x Mill Rate Factor / 1,000 + Base Tax = Municipal Property Tax

School Division Tax Calculation:

Taxable Assessment x Mill rate / 1,000 = School Division Tax

Municipal Tax Levy - \$1,845,966
Includes: The municipal portion of taxes levied on all properties throughout the municipality after early payment discounts & abatements.

■ Grants in Lieu of Taxes - \$234,801 Includes: Payment from provincial Crown Corporations (TransGas, Sasktel Comm., Sask. Ag & Food).

■ Grants - \$390,056 Includes: Provincial Revenue Sharing Grant, Federal Gas Tax Grant, SGI Traffic Safety Grant, Pest Control Grant.

■ Fees & Charges - \$153,226 Includes: Sale of maps, tax certificates, custom work fees, subdivision fees, building permit fees, tipping fees.

■ Capital Asset & Land Sales Gain - \$868 Includes: Gains or losses from the sale of municipal assets & land.







BYLAW NO. 17-08

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR A BASE TAX

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Beaver River No. 622 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

- 1. This bylaw shall be known as the "Base Tax Bylaw".
- 2. A base tax shall apply to the types and classifications of property included in the table below:

- 3. Where a property is classified within more than one property classification by the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency, the base tax calculation shall be considered independently and applied to each classification.
- 4. Bylaw No. 08/16 is hereby repealed.

5. This bylaw shall come into effect January 1, 2017.

BYLAW NO 02-23

A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH MILL RATE FACTORS

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Beaver River # 622 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. This bylaw shall be known as the "Mill Rate Factor Bylaw".

2. The following mill rate factor(s) shall be applied to the uniform mill rate levied

against all taxable property for municipal purposes: 1

Classification	Factor
a) Agricultural	0.5569
b) Residential	0.5569
c) Commercial & Industrial	3.36

3. Bylaw # 17-09 is hereby repealed.

4. This bylaw shall come into effect on January 1, 2023.

What to do if drainage into an RM ditch is causing a problem

Unapproved Works


If a landowner has existing or new drainage works which drain onto any RM administered lands (including undeveloped road allowances) above the point of adequate outlet, then the RM can file a Request For Assistance with WSA. WSA will confirm the presence of drainage works and whether the works have an approval. If unapproved drainage works are present, the landowner will be required by WSA to either obtain approval or close the drainage works. To get approval the landowner will need to obtain land control from the RM and the RM can, at that point, ensure that appropriate mitigation steps are taken to ensure no further damage will be caused.

Approved Works

If there is approved drainage into an RM ditch and damage is being caused, the RM should notify WSA, either by completing a Request for Assistance or sending a letter, referencing section 83.01 of The Water Security Agency Act, and ask WSA to take action to modify the requirements of the approval to mitigate the damage being caused.


