How to Make a Rental Reduction Request on Agricultural Crown Land

The Rental Reduction Request Form can be completed by any agricultural Crown land lessee who has experienced uninsurable losses on their leased land due to an uncontrollable natural event (i.e. flooding, fire). The lessee is required to complete the form by declaring that the losses were ineligible for insurance coverage. The form must be submitted by October 1. Once a completed form is received, it will be reviewed by a Land Management Specialist who will work with the lessee to verify the request which may include a land inspection or the development of a restoration plan. 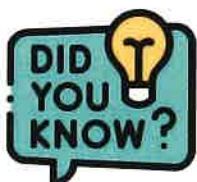

PIERCELAND DETACHMENT RCMP REPORT



The Pierceland RCMP would like to provide a quarterly update on calls for service in the RM of Beaver River. Between April 01/2024 and June 26/2024, the Pierceland RCMP responded to the following calls for service:

There were a total of 147 calls for service, and 45 calls cleared by charge. There were 6 calls involving Traffic Accidents, 51 calls for service involving Provincial Traffic Offences, with 28 charges laid. There were 3 calls regarding Impaired Operation Related Offences, and 3 cleared by charges and 1 flight from police. There were 8 calls regarding Provincial Statutes, such as Liquor Act, Fire Prevention Act, trespass act, 5 calls for service involving Disturbing the Peace and 3 calls involving Weapon Offences. There were 3 calls involving Drug Enforcement. Crimes against person, such as Domestic Violence which are a Divisional Priority, Pierceland RCMP responded to 4 Assaults and 1 Discharge Firearm. Thefts and Possession of Property Obtained By Crime involved 4 calls for service. Mischief involved 3 calls and Break and Enter resulted in 2 calls for service. Furthermore, there were 13 calls regarding suspicious vehicles, abandoned vehicles and several false alarms.

The Pierceland RCMP welcomes persons with information on drug trafficking in the RM of Beaver River to contact the Pierceland RCMP if they are willing to provide confidential information on any illegal drug activity in the area of Pierceland.
